60th Anniversary of CNU, the Year to Fly Higher!

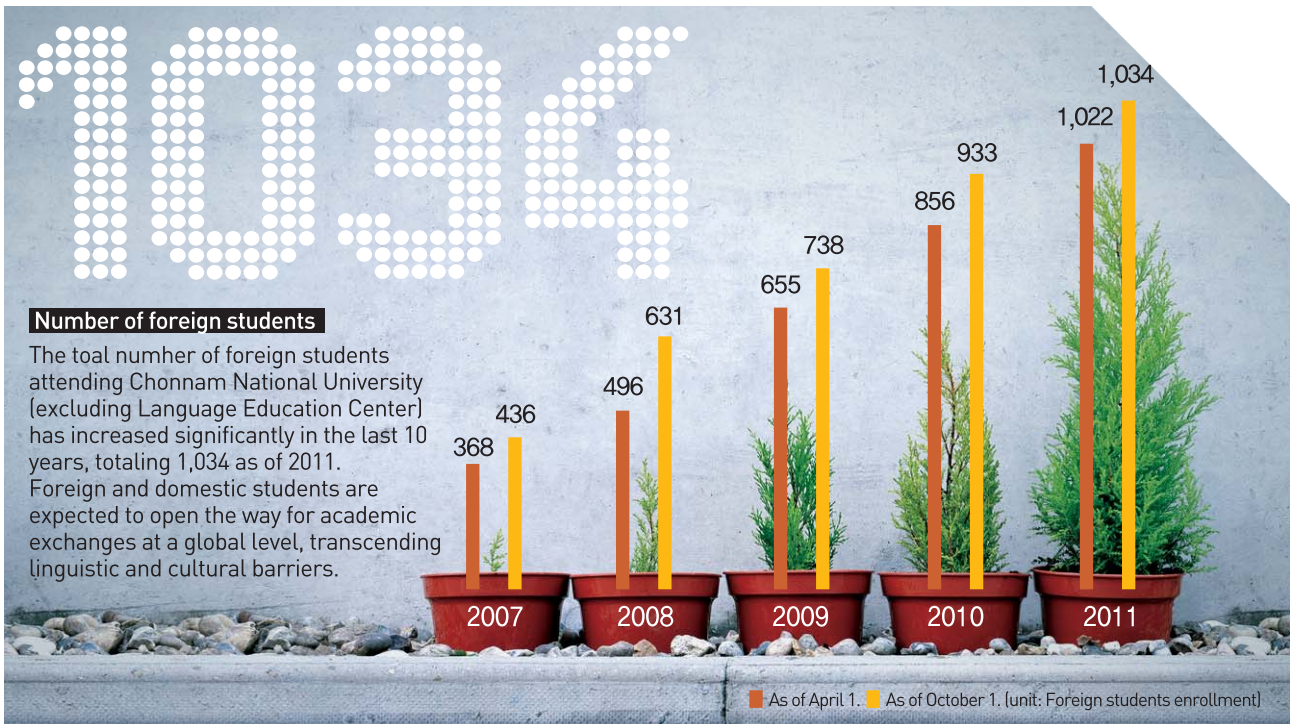

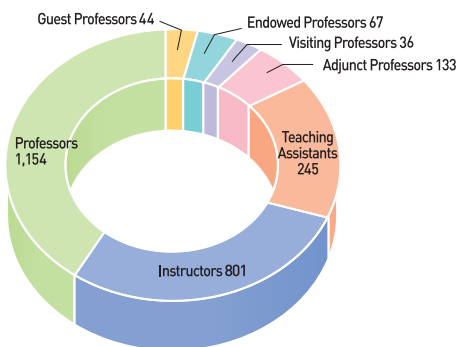

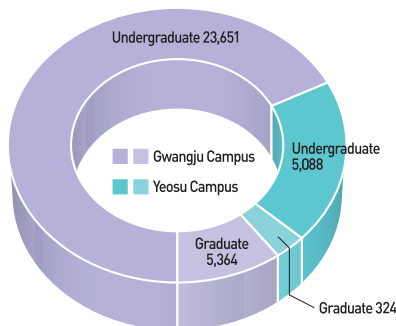

▼ Faculty (as of April 2012)



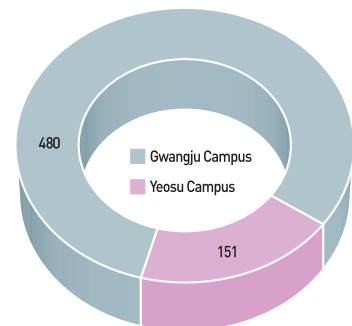
Total number of faculty

▼ Students (as of April 2012)



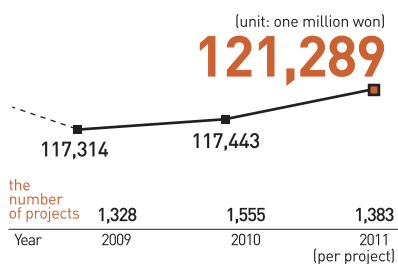

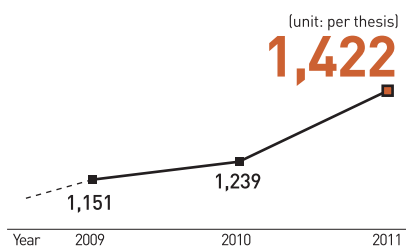

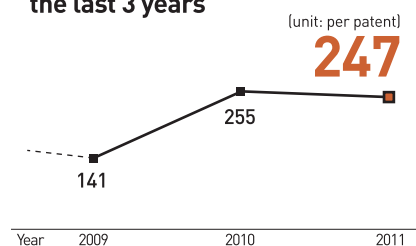
▼ Annual research fund budget during the last 3 years

Graduate School

Graduate students in master's and doctoral programs play a pivotal role in improving the research capacity of CNU and in proposing a new vision for the local industry.

29 departments in Humanities and Social Sciences, 26 departments in Natural Sciences, 12 departments in Engineering, 4 departments in Arts, 3 departments in Medical Sciences and 31 departments in Interdisciplinary Programs have master's and doctoral programs at the Gwangju campus. 5 departments in Humanities and Social Sciences, 6 departments in Natural Sciences, 13 departments in Engineering and 2 departments in Interdisciplinary Programs provide master's and doctoral programs at the Yeosu campus.

Integrated Master's and Undergraduate Courses (awarding Bachelor's and Master's degrees in 5 years)

CNU Integrated Master's and Undergraduate Course, established in the fall of 2007, is the first of its kind among national universities. The course integrates undergraduate courses and master's courses by reducing one semester from each course so that students can receive a master's degree in five years. Students who have applied for this program are capable of deciding their career earlier and carefully preparing for their future. The course offers various benefits and support to participants.

CNU's Graduate School of Education offers majors and educational theories and also helps students develop problem-solving skills for various challenges they will face at schools and in classrooms. The Graduate School of Education enables in-service and preliminary teachers to self-develop and expand their professional teaching skills and ultimately serve as pillars of Korea's public education system.

Graduate School of Industry and Technology

CNU's Graduate School of Industry and Technology is a renowned institute that nurtures competitive global leaders and engineering experts.

Graduate School of Public Administration

The Graduate School of Public Administration promotes research and instruction of theories and applications in the area of public administration and related disciplines. The programs provided produce competent public administrators in this highly industrialized society.

Graduate School of University-Industry Cooperation (Yeosu Campus)

The Graduate School of University-Industry Cooperation fosters highly skilled and creative technicians by providing practical education in industrial technology.

Graduate School of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences (Yeosu Campus)

CNU's Graduate School of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences contributes to the national development of the fishery industry by nurturing maritime and fisheries specialists armed with leadership and creativity.



Graduate School of Business Administration

As the first professional graduate school of business outside of Seoul, the CNU MBA aims to foster competent business professionals who lead industrial development beyond Gwangju and the Jeonnam region.

The CNU MBA admits 100 persons in two kinds of programs. The Pan-Asia Capstone MBA (PAC MBA) is a full-time, weekday program. The Pan-Asia Capstone Executive MBA (PAC EMBA) is an evening or weekend program for those currently working or with work experience.

Graduate School of Culture

CNU Graduate School of Culture, the first of its kind nationwide, cultivates leaders with creativity and specialty in culture who will guide the Dream Society.

There are three majors: Culture and Art Theory, Culture Management and Tourism, and Media Art Engineering. Affiliated research centers in Ecology Tourism, and Local Culture are also within the school. It selects 30 students a year, regardless of one's major/study at the undergraduate level.

Graduate School of Law

The School of Law emphasizes public interest and human rights and aims to foster global law officials with professional knowledge and experience.

Established in March, 2009, the School of Law admits 120 students including 40 students from non-prelaw majors and 40 students from other universities. 10 percent of the quota is admitted through a special screening system among socially disadvantaged groups.

Medical School

The CNU Medical School aspires to produce true medical personnel who have the proper personality and morality as doctors and are willing to contribute themselves to the well-being of humanity by studying the fundamentals of medicine.

The School of Medicine admits 63 students: 34 students are admitted through a non-scheduled admission process (local applicants with good grades among those who graduated from universities outside of Gwangju, or the Chonnam area, applicants with good grades among those who graduated from universities in Gwangju or the Chonnam area, self-promoting applicants) and 29 students from a scheduled screening system.

Graduate School of Dental Science

The College of Dentistry reorganized into School of Dentistry and is making great strides toward becoming a first-rate school of dentistry.

The Graduate School of Dental Science admits 70 students through a special screening system among applicants with good school grades. Students who apply for both masters and doctorate programs will receive scholarships.



The total amount of research funds that CNU professors were rewarded exceeded 120 billion won, enlisting CNU as a top-10 research university in Korea. CNU was also selected as a world-class research university. CNU is on sound footing in terms of research capacity.

Library

The CNU library consists of the main library, annex library, Yeosu library, medical library, law library and agriculture library. The main and annex libraries house about 5,300 carrels, over 1.2 million books and over 2,000 kinds of periodicals. In addition, the CNU library offers an online database as well as an electronic journal and e-book services. Students have no trouble using most library services on-line such as searching and viewing original texts as well as searching and requesting photocopies of other institutes' data from CNU's homepage. Language Education Center (LEC)

The center provides systematic foreign language education programs to enhance university competence and improve student's language proficiency in the era of globalization. A variety of courses including English conversation with native speakers, intensive programs during vacations, English for job employment, and other languages such as Japanese, Chinese, French, Spanish, Russian, and German are provided, too. It also runs specialized programs for the Korean Teacher Education and Korean courses for international students.



Institute of Liberal Education

The center consists of sub-centers each for General Education, Teaching and Learning, and E-learning. It develops and runs various programs to strengthen liberal education, enhance teaching ability of professors and learning of students, and foster talent through interdisciplinary ability.

Student Residence Halls

The Student Residence Halls provide housing and board for 4,000 students at the Gwangju Campus and 966 at the Yeosu Campus. They are equipped with computer labs, study halls, student lounges, laundry rooms, cafeterias, convenience stores and group study rooms. They also provide self-development programs.



Sports Center

The CNU Sports Center opened in 2006. Students can enjoy various sporting activities including golf, yoga, jazz diet, badminton, dance, sports and pilates. It also runs physical fitness assessment rooms to provide tailored exercise service depending on age, health condition, disease/illness and physical capacity. Tax Benefits

- Private Donors
According to the Income Tax Law, donors to CNU are eligible to receive a **100 percent tax deduction**.
Donations to other institutions have benefits of only a 10 percent tax deduction.
- Corporate Donor
When the donation accounts for 50% of yearly earnings (after the deduction of the donation and the deficit), it is considered as a donation of entire earnings.
- Donation of Inherited Property
The entire donation will be exempt from inheritance taxes (as long as the act of donation is done within 6 months of inheritance.)

Benefits for Donors

- A donation receipt is issued for tax deduction.
- Following the amount of donation, CNU confers titles of Yongbong Fellow (100 million won and above), Mudeung Fellow (50 million won and above), Camellia Fellow (10 million won and above) and Royal Azalea Fellow (2 million won and above).
- Plaque of donors is attached to the front gate of the headquarters.
- All donors are recorded in the 'History of CNU'.
- A plaque of appreciation as well as souvenirs are awarded to donors during the appreciation ceremony.
- Depending on the amount of the donation, CNU invites donors to major events, provides them with periodicals and benefits to use university facilities (Language Education Center, Sports Center, School of Lifelong Education and Animal Hospital) and CNU Hospital and Dental Hospital.

How Development Funds Are Used

CNU designates the use of funds for scholarship projects, supporting academic exchanges, purchasing books, supporting education and research facilities, and student welfare projects; private donors designate the use of funds for special programs.

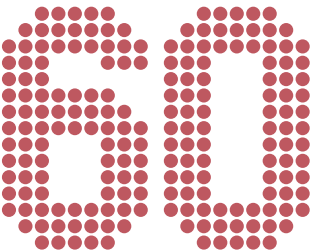

■ Advantages for Students with Excellence on Korean SAT

Tuition and Dormitory Fee (total/partial) Support

- **Full scholarship** : exemption of tuition and dormitory fees for 4 years
 - Humanities track – high school graduates with the minimum of 2nd level grade in Korean, a foreign language, and social studies
 - Science and engineering track – high school graduates with the minimum of 2nd level grade in math and science
 - **Half scholarship**: 50 % of tuition and dormitory fee for 4 years is exempt
 - Science and engineering – high school graduates with the minimum of 3rd level grade in math and science
- ※ 15 and more credits per semester with 3.75 and above GPA
※ Students in the School of Medicine/Nursery/Education and from supplementary admission within the regular program are exempted from.
