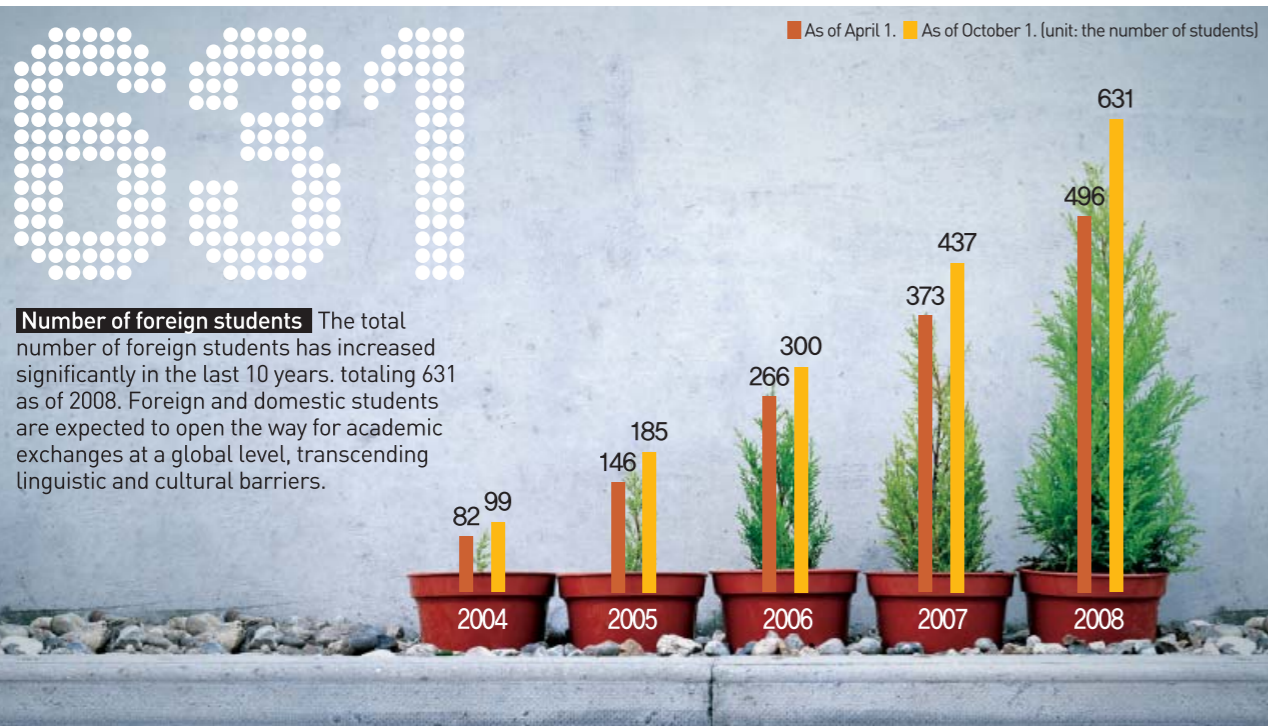

Over the past twelve years, the University has ranked eighth in terms of research expenditures and tenth in terms of papers listed in the Science Citation Index.

Excellence in education and research has helped define CNU for over six decades. We are committed to continuing this tradition, instilling hope and excitement among our stakeholders. We ask for your continued support as the University and Korea as a whole embrace our emerging roles as world leaders.

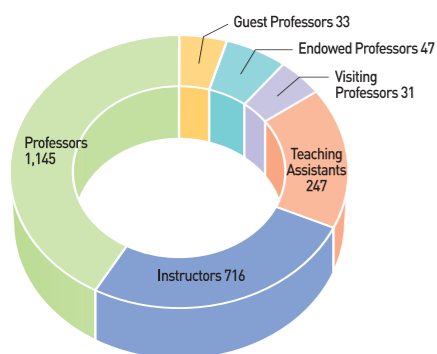

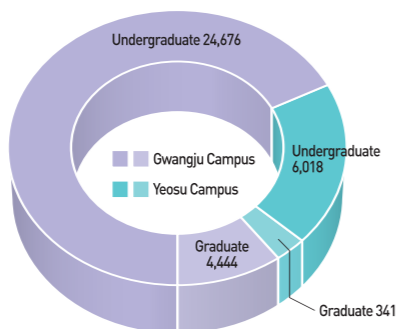


▼ Faculty (as of December 2008)



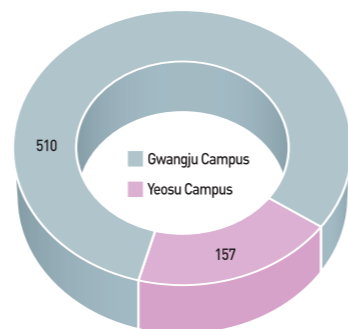
Total number of faculty

▼ Students (as of December 2008)



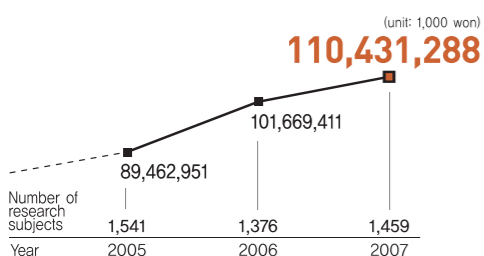
Total number of students

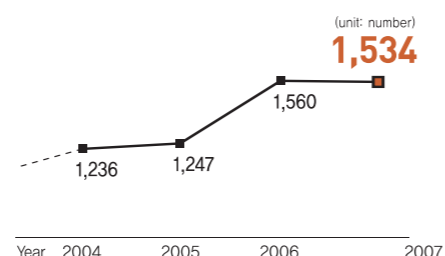

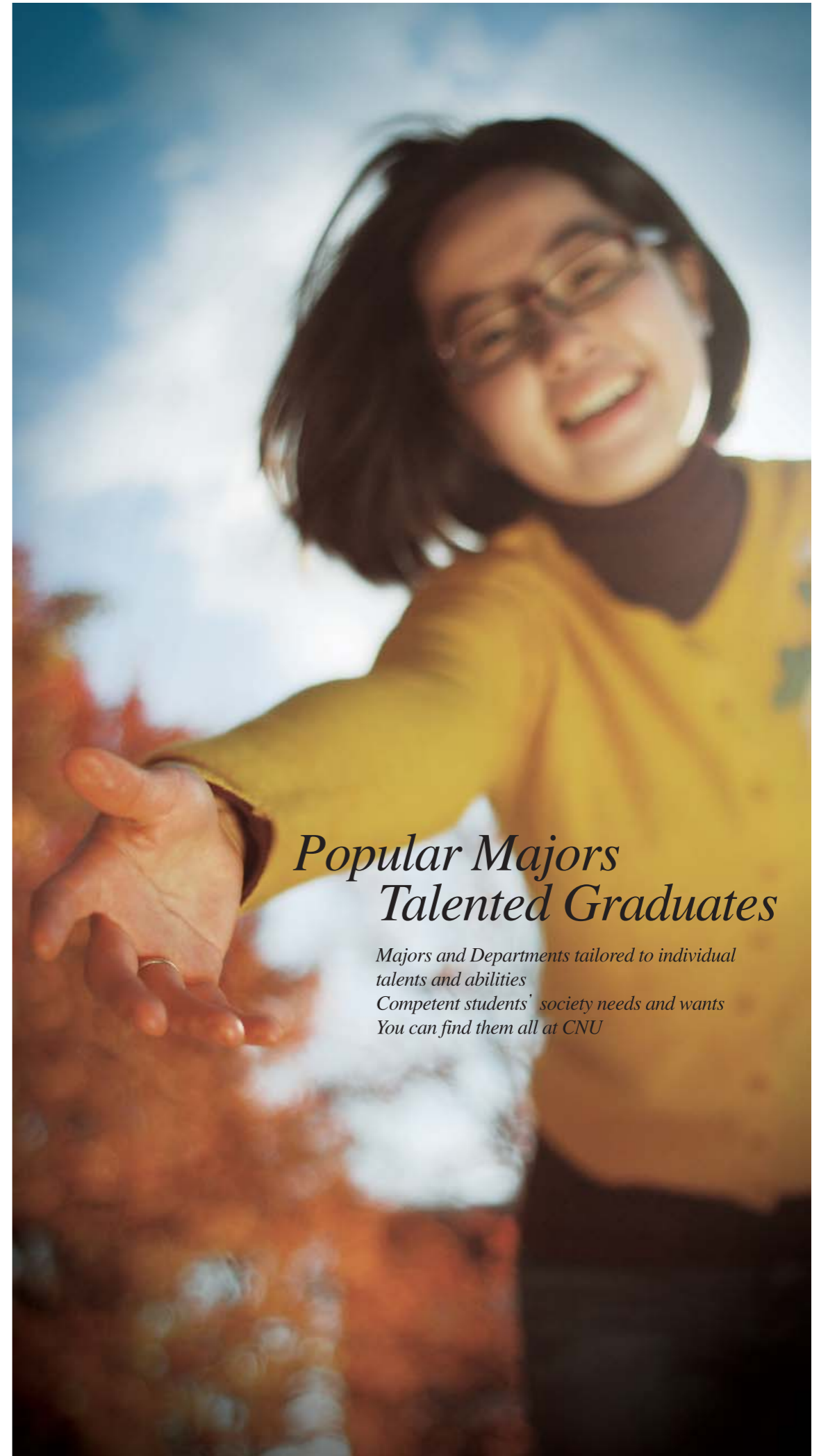

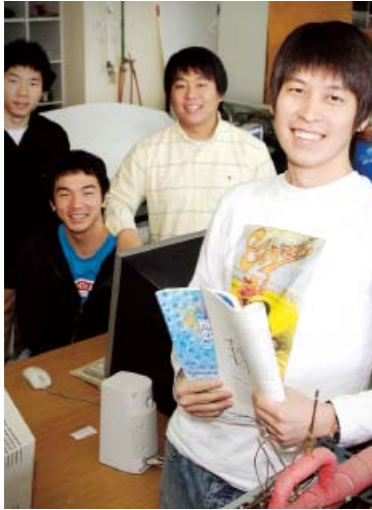


College of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences (Yeosu)

Graduate School

Graduate students in master's and doctoral programs play a pivotal role in improving the research capacity of CNU and in proposing a new vision for the local industry. 29 departments in Humanities and Social Sciences, 24 departments in Natural Sciences, 12 departments in Engineering, 4 departments in Arts, 2 departments in Medical Sciences and 28 departments in Interdisciplinary Programs have master's and doctoral programs at the Gwangju campus. 5 departments in Humanities and Social Sciences, 5 departments in Natural Sciences, 14 departments in Engineering and 2 departments in Interdisciplinary Programs provide master's and doctoral programs at the Yeosu campus.

Integrated Master's and Undergraduate Courses (awarding Bachelor's and Master's degrees in 5 years)

CNU Integrated Master's and Undergraduate Course, established in the fall of 2007, is the first of its kind among national universities. The course integrates undergraduate courses and master's courses by reducing one semester from each course so that students can receive a master's degree in five years. Students who have applied for this program are capable of deciding their career earlier and carefully preparing for their future. The course offers various benefits and support to participants.

Graduate School of Education

CNU's Graduate School of Education offers majors and educational theories and also helps students develop problem-solving skills for various challenges they will face at schools and in classrooms. The Graduate School of Education enables in-service and preliminary teachers to self-develop and expand their professional teaching skills and ultimately serve as pillars of Korea's public education system.

Graduate School of Industry and Technology

CNU's Graduate School of Industry and Technology is a renowned institute that nurtures competitive global leaders and engineering experts.

Graduate School of Public Administration

The Graduate School of Public Administration promotes research and instruction of theories and applications in the area of public administration and related disciplines. The programs provided produce competent public administrators in this highly industrialized society.

Graduate School of University-Industry Cooperation (Yeosu Campus)

The Graduate School of University-Industry Cooperation fosters highly skilled and creative technicians by providing practical education in industrial technology.

Graduate School of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences (Yeosu Campus)

CNU's Graduate School of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences contributes to the national development of the fishery industry by nurturing maritime and fisheries specialists armed with leadership and creativity.



Graduate School of Business Administration

As the first professional graduate school of business outside of Seoul, the CNU MBA aims to foster competent business professionals who lead industrial development beyond Gwangju and the Jeonnam region.

The CNU MBA admits 100 persons in two kinds of programs. The Pan-Asia Capstone MBA (PAC MBA) is a full-time, weekday program. The Pan-Asia Capstone Executive MBA (PAC EMBA) is an evening or weekend program for those currently working or with work experience.

Graduate School of Culture

The Graduate School of Culture is the only professional graduate school of culture in Korea and trains key talented personnel in the 'culture' area, which serves as the strategic industry of the cultural city of Gwangju.

The Graduate School of Culture has three majors - Culture and Art Theory & Planning, Culture & Tourism and Media Art Engineering. 30 students receive admission every year.

Law School

The CNU Law School aims to nurture prominent professionals equipped with sufficient legal knowledge and practical skills. CNU Law School intends to specialize in the areas of public interests and human rights to produce global talent beyond Korea.

CNU Law School is scheduled to open in March 2009. To fill its admission quota of 120 students, it plans to select 40 students from different backgrounds such as non-law majors as well as graduates from other universities. CNU Law School also meets 10 percent of its quota by admitting financially disadvantaged students through a special admission program.

Medical School

The CNU Medical School aspires to produce true medical personnel who have the proper personality and morality as doctors and are willing to contribute themselves to the well-being of humanity by studying the fundamentals of medicine.

The CNU Medical School opens in March 2009. There is a special admission program for outstanding students from universities in Gwangju and the Jeonnam area. The Medical School will select 63 students.

School of Dentistry

The College of Dentistry reorganized into School of Dentistry and is making great strides toward becoming a first-rate school of dentistry.

The admission quota for this program is 60 students; students who have graduated from universities in Gwangju and the Jeonnam area can apply for a special admission program. The scholarship preferably goes to graduates from universities in Gwangju and the Jeonnam region.

Student Residence Halls

The Student Residence Halls provide housing and board for 3,140 students at the Gwangju Campus and 966 at the Yeosu Campus. They are equipped with computer labs, study halls, student lounges, laundry rooms, cafeterias, convenience stores and group study rooms. They also provide self-development programs.

Sports Center

The CNU Sports Center opened in 2006. Students can enjoy various sporting activities including golf, yoga, jazz diet, badminton, dance, sports and pilates. It also runs physical fitness assessment rooms to provide tailored exercise service depending on age, health condition, disease/illness and physical capacity. Exercise prescription experts manage an obesity clinic to help students enjoy their free time and maintain their physical health.

Language Education Center

CNU's Language Education Center boasts systematic foreign language programs suited to strengthen CNU's competitiveness and improve students' foreign language skills. The Language Education Center offers a wide range of English programs including English conversation courses, intensive programs and job preparatory English courses. It also offers non-English programs including Japanese, Chinese, and French. Finally it runs special programs such as TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages), a Korean language teacher training program, and Korean language courses for foreigners.

Library

The CNU library consists of the main library, annex library, Yeosu library, medical library, law library and agriculture library. The main and annex libraries house about 5,300 carrels, over 1.2 million books and over 2,000 kinds of periodicals. In addition, the CNU library offers an online database as well as an electronic journal and e-book services. Students have no trouble using most library services on-line such as searching and viewing original texts as well as searching and requesting photocopies of other institutes' data from CNU's homepage. 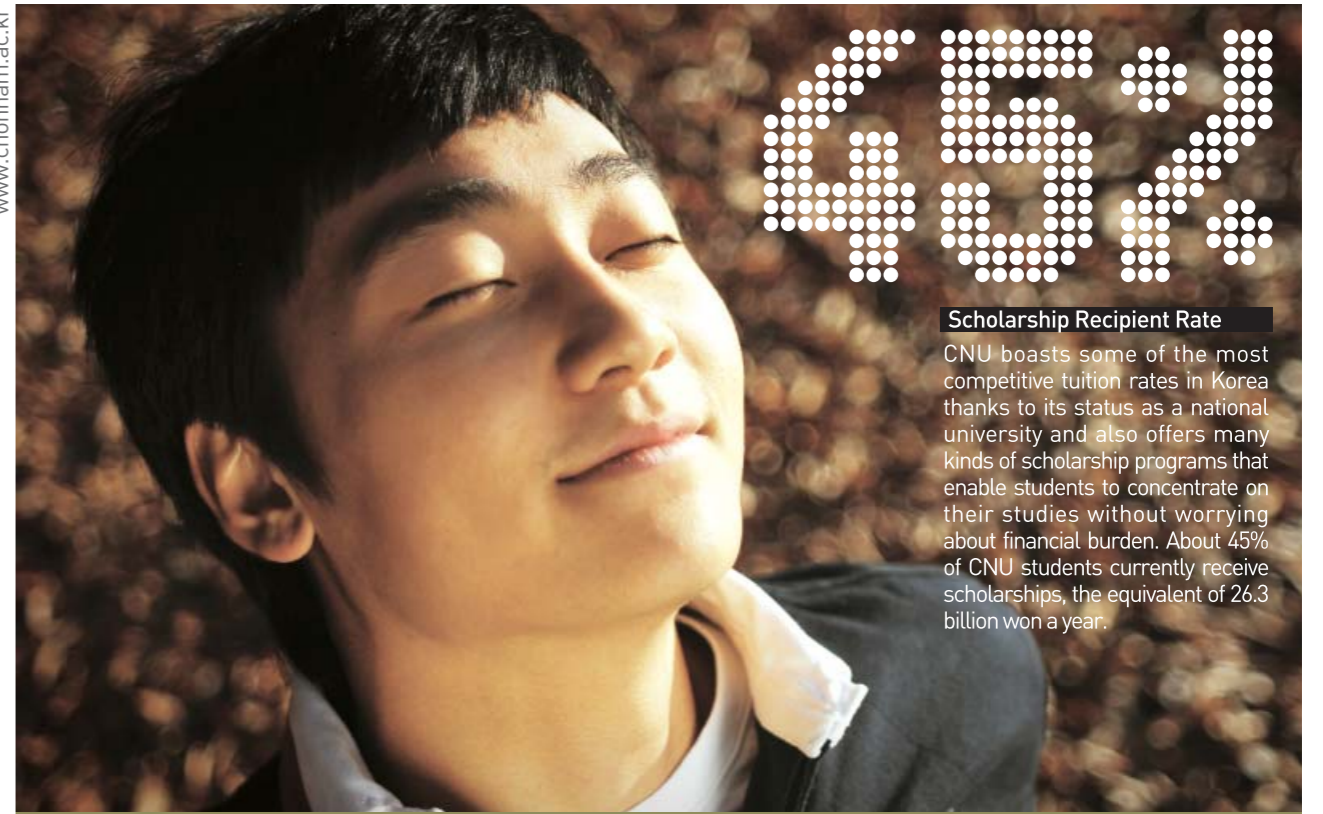

CNU offers various scholarship programs so that high-achieving students can develop into key global leaders.

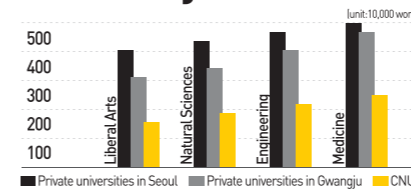
Scholarship Recipient Rate

Tax Benefits

- Private Donors
According to the Income Tax Law, donors to CNU are eligible to receive a **100 percent tax deduction**.
Donations to other institutions have benefits of only a 10 to 20 percent tax deduction.
- The entire profits are included in expenses within a 75 percent limit of profits (by 2008).
- In the case of donating inherited property, the inheritance tax imposed on donating property is exempted.

Benefits for Donors

- A donation receipt is issued for tax deduction.
- Following the amount of donation, CNU confers titles of Yongbong Fellow (100 million won and above), Mudeung Fellow (50 million won and above), Camellia Fellow (10 million won and above) and Royal Azalea Fellow (2 million won and above).
- Plaque of donors is attached to the front gate of the headquarters.
- All donors are recorded in the 'History of CNU'.
- A plaque of appreciation as well as souvenirs are awarded to donors during the appreciation ceremony.
- Depending on the amount of the donation, CNU invites donors to major events, provides them with periodicals and benefits to use university facilities (Language Education Center, Sports Center, School of Lifelong Education and Animal Hospital) and CNU Hospital and Dental Hospital.
